


Co-writing Strategies

From analyses of authorship declarations in these at UWA, we know the majority of you publish during the course of candidature and most of these publications are co-authored. Authorship trends (see figure below from the OECD (<u>Economic Globalisation Indicators</u>) also suggest that later in your continuing research career you will be more likely to co-author papers than to write single author papers.



Trends in co-operation in science, 1985 - 2007

To best manage co-authorship, you may consider developing a collaborating and co-authoring strategy. Co-authorship is often easier the roles of the collaboration are discussed early and revisited a number of times during the co-writing process. You will need to adapt recommended strategies to the needs of the task and the strengths and weaknesses of you and your co-authors. The strategy will also need to be flexible to allow for change during the course of the collaboration.
